Below are a few items that you may find useful in your work with the international community:

ENHANCEMENTS TO THE RI REPRESENTATIVE NETWORK

In follow-up to recommendations from a number of Representatives earlier this Rotary year, External Relations prepared an item on the Representative Network for consideration by the RI Board of Directors. The item largely asked the Board to reaffirm its commitment to the program and consider two enhancements:

1. Expansion of the Rotary Representative Network to **four** international institutions:

RI Staff will be working with President-elect Ron Burton to find qualified Rotarians to fill those positions for the 2013-14 Rotary year. Once appointed, I staff will work with those Representatives to secure official recognition/consultative status with each of those organizations.

2. Youth" RI Representatives where appropriate:

(Please note: at this time, only the United Nations/ New York offers special "youth" Representative opportunities.)

The United Nations Department of Public Information in New York has developed provisions within its credentialing process for the appointment of two additional "youth representatives" (ages 18-24). Traditionally, Rotary only permitted Rotarians to hold the status of RI Representative. With the RI Board's approval, External Relations will work with the

Representatives in New York to identify qualified Rotaractors for the President-elect's approval to fill the two additional "youth" positions.

POLIO OP-ED IN THE HUFFINGTON POST

Recently, RI General Secretary, John Hewko, and Jeffrey Sachs, Director of the Earth Institute at Columbia University, jointly penned an op-ed titled "the Final Push to Eradicate Polio," published online via the *Huffington Post*. Thanks to the efforts of Representative Michel Jazzar, the 24 Rotary Clubs of Lebanon will announce a collaboration with UN-ESCWA in December. The collaboration will focus on the development of teaching tools on the UN Millennium Development Goals, in Arabic, for use by 1,000 high schools, universities, and civil society organizations.
